Communication:

Communication between students is a key component of Green Connections, as one of the primary goals for this program is to build relationships and understanding between students living at opposite ends of the water supply system.

It is expected that students in partnering schools will have open, on-going communication with each other throughout the entire Green Connections program. This includes the classroom portions of the program as well as on the field trips. Communication is expected to be balanced between social, informal interaction (such as personal letters or emails) and more structured sharing pertaining to the educational aspects of the program (for example, sharing student work via digital photographs, video tours of the school and local neighborhood, or video conferencing to share results from a research topic related to the watershed).

- 3. Our students will work with their technology teacher to create a webpage about our school and community that we will share with our partner school.

Time and Curriculum Requirements for Participation in Green Connections:

Participation in Green Connections is an extremely rewarding experience for teachers and students alike. Lessons and activities are designed for exploring and celebrating the watershed and the New York City water supply system. Relationships develop along with an understanding of how similar people live in very different physical, yet intertwined, environments.

Participation is also a big responsibility. Please carefully consider the time commitments, dedication and expectations described in the following section. Your signature documents that you will follow the listed requirements.

Requirements

The 2013 *Green Connections* program requires all selected teachers to:

- 1. Attend a kick-off meeting on January 17, 2013 (snow date Jan 24).
- 2. Attend a wrap-up meeting in June. Date determined at January 17th meeting.
- 3. Communicate at least three times with partnering school.
- 4. Teach the 12 provided lessons that address specific aspects of the watershed. (Topics include: the NYC drinking water supply system, protecting drinking water supplies upstate and downstate, watershed protection and open space, forest management in the watershed, and the history and culture of people in the watershed and NYC.)
- 5. Help modify the lesson plans (originally written for 4-8th grades) for your students if you are a 9-12th grade teacher selected for this program. Catskill Center staff will be available to help modify any lessons.
- 6. Complete a brief (5 minute) online survey that evaluates each lesson from your perspective, and describe the educational outcomes.
- 7. Have a discussion with your school administrator to ensure you have their support for the program.
